* A fine bop-based guitarist, Joshua Breakstone discovered jazz when he was 14. He studied for several years with guitarist Sal Salvador, while still playing regularly with a rock group. He attended Berklee College of Music. In 1977, he toured Canada with reed player Glen Hall, making his recording debut on Hall's Sonora release. After teaching guitar at the Rhode Island Conservatory of Music (1979-1981), Breakstone worked in New York with Warne Marsh, Emily Remler, Dave Schmitter, and Vic Juris. In 1983, he recorded his first album (Wonderful!) for Sonora, with Barry Harris on piano. His follow-up recordings featured Kenny Baron on piano. Breakstone went on to record for Contemporary (including a quartet featuring Pepper Adams), Capri, Evidence, and Double-Time, helping keep the legacy of quiet bop guitar alive.
